There is a lot of **free money** out there for college students if you know where to look! The counseling department has gathered lots of information and resources for you to use in your scholarship search! New scholarships will be updated regularly on the EDHS counseling department website and added to our newsletters.

Michigan Oil and Gas Producers Education Foundation

The Michigan Oil & Gas Producers Education Foundation sponsors a scholarship program for Michigan high school senior students accepted for enrollment at a Michigan university or community college, having a minimum grade point average of 3.0 (computed on a 4.0 scale), and demonstrating financial need. Qualified applicants must also be pursuing a degree in a field of study which will allow them to obtain full time employment in the crude oil and natural gas industry. There will be scholarships with a minimum of \$500 to be paid directly to the university or college where the applicant is enrolled. Applications can be found on the counseling website or picked up in the counseling office.

Brandon Bonkowski Scholarship

Scholarship 1

Available to Michigan high school seniors, or current undergraduate students who have been accepted at a university or community college, or trade school, who have had to overcome some form of learning disability, i.e. A.D.D., A.D.H.D., Asperger's Syndrome, dyslexia or similar challenge. (\$1,000.00 award).

These applicants should write a 300-500 word essay explaining the disability, and how they have persevered to overcome it.

Scholarship 2

Available to Michigan undergraduate students enrolled full time in a university or community college carrying a GPA of 2.5 or better. (\$1,000.00 award)

Essay topic: (300-500 words) - "10 reasons why you are awesome."

Applications for both of the above awards should be submitted before the June 15th 2015 deadline via e-mail to theresadubay@wowway.com. Please include a letter with your contact information and which college you are attending and which scholarship you are applying for.

Odenza Marketing Group Scholarship

To be considered eligible for the Odenza Marketing Group Fall Scholarship you must:

- A) Be between the ages of 16 and 25 on March 30th, 2015
- B) Submit answers to the essay questions, which can be found on the application page, prior to the March 30th, 2015 deadline.
- C) Have at least one full year of post-secondary studies remaining at the time of the award
- D) Have a GPA of 2.5 or greater.

Lifestyle Dentistry Scholarships

To be considered eligible for the Lifestyle Dentistry Scholarship you must:

- A) Be attending college or university no later than September 30th, 2015. Current High School Seniors who will graduate in 2015 are eligible. You can be enrolled in any field of study.
- B) Submit answers to the essay question, which can be found on the application page, **prior to the June 30th, 2015 deadline.**
- C) Have a GPA of 2.5 or greater.
- D) Be a resident of Canada or the United States

The scholarship winner will be announced roughly six weeks after the deadline and will be posted on this website immediately after. All applications must be received by 11:59pm ET on June 30th, 2015. No late applications will be reviewed.

Cognizant Making the Future Scholarship Program

This scholarship is for students pursuing careers in a STEM field. To qualify, applicants must be eligible to enroll or be currently enrolled at a two- or four-year accredited college or university with a full course of undergraduate study or a vocational-technical school. Applicants must also have a minimum 2.5 GPA. This scholarship is design-based and to apply applicants will be required to submit documentation of a hands-on project that illustrates creativity and innovation. **Award - \$5,000**

Herbert Lehman Scholarship

This scholarship is for high school seniors, high school graduates and currently enrolled college freshman. To qualify for this scholarship, applicants must be planning to attend or be currently attending an accredited four-year college or university. Applicants must be of excellent character and be able to present strong academic records, test scores, and personal essays. Applicants must have a demonstrable record of community and school involvement that reveals exceptional leadership potential with a capacity to work well in diverse settings. Moreover, they must provide strong recommendations from teachers, community representatives, or employers. Non-US citizens are eligible for this scholarship. **Award - \$2,000**

Worldstudio AIGA Scholarship

This scholarship is for students who are majoring in and pursuing an undergrad or graduate degree in advertising (art direction only), fine arts, graphic design, illustration, interactive design/motion graphics, and photography. High school seniors are eligible, provided they can provide proof of enrollment in a college or university for the fall 2015/spring 2015 academic year. Applicants must be enrolled full-time, have at least a 2.0 GPA, and demonstrate financial need. To qualify for this scholarship, applicants must be US citizens or green card holders. Though not a requirement, minority status is a significant factor considered in the award decisions. Applications open 2/1. **Award - \$500 to \$5000.**
